NTI will soon publish on its website a UAE country report/analysis, which highlights new activity at the sites in the UAE where there allegedly are North Korean missiles bunkered (some of this data comes from Google Earth), suggests that the activity could signal an expansion, and raises questions about the UAE's commitment to nonproliferation (as well questions about the UAE's commitment to abide to certain missile control treaties/guidelines). Carmen wanted us to know that this is coming, and that NTI will also give Hamad Al Kaabi an official notification (since he is also an NTI board member).

Carmen also wanted us to know that media continues to chase this possible story.

For example, Jeffrey Lewis is the researcher at the Center for Nonproliferation Studies who is doing the analysis for NTI. He apparently is well connected to reporters who cover these type of things, and he told Carmen that he has already been contacted by David Kirkpatrick from the Times about the alleged missiles in the UAE, and has gotten questions from other media. According to Lewis, Kirkpatrick wants to do a story on this topic, but so far has only found circumstantial evidence and anecdotal comments. The NTI report may give Kirkpatrick some additional substance.

I heard this third-hand – so take it for what it is worth – but Kirkpatrick also apparently told Lewis that he is also working on another story that will “embarrass” the UAE, and that it – along with a possible missile story – will raise questions about the UAE as an ally and actor in the region.
